The 2010 Annual Pacific Rim Bloodhound Club Northwest Regional Specialty & Supported Show was held on August 21st and 22nd, 2010 in Enumclaw Washington. PRBC broke from our traditional setting in Auburn and offered an in-conjuction show with the Olympic Kennel Club this year at the Enumclaw Exposition Center. In this venue we were able to participate in a larger show with more breeds and less work for our club members.

The show was chaired by Sonnya Crawford but, although not an "official" chairperson, Suzi Paine was instrumental in putting this show together. Ms. Paine was our liason to the Olympic Kennel Club and did all the ground work and research that allowed us to have an in-conjunction show. True to her role as mentor, she stayed abreast of all the various needs,



projects and responsibilities that kept the committees running smoothly.

August 21st was a beautiful day. The weather was perfect for a dog show and the venue was wonderful. We were able to visit other breeds, many

At ringside, the table was beautifully set with trophies chosen and arranged by Janis Hardy which included buckets of treats and toys, blankets, and lovely bloodhound canisters. Our Regional trophies each year feature the coveted Ken Wheeler Memorial award for Best of Winners, which

Rescue Report

December 2010 ~ Sonnya Crawford

We have had very little activity this fall. We currently have 3 hounds: Louie, Annabelle, and Macy.

Annabelle was found as a stray. She was full of milk, but wasn't with her pups. We suspect that the breeder was done breeding her and dumped her. She is about 6 years old, with heavy wear and staining on her teeth. She is quite small for a bloodhound---a



nice little package for someone who wants a housepet and companion. She is very sweet, loving, and a bit needy. She doesn't seem to mind other dogs, although she is territorial of her space (ie, crate, car). She is terrified of getting into cages and cars, but settles down once she is in. If you have a big heart and the patience to help a puppy mill dog adjust to a normal life, please consider adding Abigail to your home.



Louis is a 3-year-old neutered male bloodhound. He is current on vaccines, dewormer, flea control and is microchipped. He lost his home because he was killing the neighbor's chickens. He is wonderful with people and children. It is clear that he was deeply loved and well

cared for as he has a very confident, happy-go-lucky personality. He is very large and extremely sweet.

Macy is a typical red bloodhound girl. She is 5-years-old and was living with a family that just didn't "get" bloodhounds and their little quirks, but we have found nothing abnormal about her. She is good with children and other dogs, has very mild separation anxiety, she is crate trained, and she knows basic commands. She has never bit



at another person or dog. The owner said that "Macy needs a better home than we can provide. She is loveable and eager to please".



On October 24th a kennel cleaning party was held at the Rescue Facility in Montesano, Washington. The runs were in bad need of a complete overhaul: removing old gravel, bringing in new gravel, a deep

scrub of the chain link and dog houses, and recarpeting of the dog houses. Many Northwest Bloodhound Search and Rescue members, along with

joint members of both PRBC and NWBSAR, showed up and knocked out the job in one day. Among those helping were Betty Seigal, Janis Hardy, Cheryl Cromeenes, Tim and Sheri Whetstine, Jim
