The By-law amendments have been made and were approved at the August 17, 1996 meeting. Copies of the current bylaws and membership packets will be sent to all members by December 1, 1996 from Suzi Paine, Vice President.

MINUTES OF 08-17-96 MEETING

The membership and Board meetings were held at Suzi Paine's house in Tacoma following a terrific BBQ. Present at the General Membership meeting were: Bonnie Varner, Suzi Paine, Jan Tweedie, Paula Rutherford, Cheri Brietinger, Noel Stockwell, Adriana Pavlinovic, Dave Lockridge. The meeting was called to order at 8:55 PM. by President Bonnie Varner. The Presidents Report: Bonnie announced that the following new members were approved: Ray & Kay Schmitt; Judy & Myron Robb; Louise & Robert Uphus; Lynne & Steve Aguirre; Julie Cook; John Bonin; Betty & Mike Henslee; Adriana Pavlinovic; Lori Hogue; Mike Tinkler; George & Sylvia Bowen; Albert & Della James; and Noel Stockwell. This brings our membership to 27! Secretary's report (Jan Tweedie): 3 membership applications pending. Katie Cole, Dave Lockridge and Alan Nichols. A summary of their applications will be in the newsletter. Copies of correspondence between Regional Specialty Chair Suzi Paine and the Yakima Kennel Club were forwarded for the file. We have received out incorporation paperwork from the state and are now all set. Treasurers Report (Lynn Harty via Suzi Paine): Previous balance was \$150.00; expenditures for state paperwork, income \$260.00 in dues. Final balance: \$410.00. A discussion ensued over distribution of money. It was M/S/P to put the bulk of the money in Savings, keep \$100 in checking, pay the check fee of \$13.00. A motion (M/S/P) to purchase an endorsement stamp for the Treasurer to use for depositing moneys.

By-Laws discussion. The membership section of the By-Laws have been amended to drop the Associate membership. All membership may vote without attending meetings however in order to hold office you must attend a minimum of 2 meetings per year. Two sponsors are required for a membership application. Applications that are turned in without sponsor information, lacking the proper fees or without signatures of the applicant on both the application and the Code of Ethics will be returned. It was decided that sponsors must complete a Sponsor Form which Suzi Paine and Adriana Pavlinovic will come up with. This avoids someone sponsoring someone they know nothing about.

Old Business. 1997 Regional was discussed. Yakima KC is furnishing a 10' x20' tent covering at ringside and has granted us a larger-than-normal ring, 50' x 70'. YKC will provide rosettes and an extra table for trophies. The BAC approved both the supported show at Richland KC on Saturday 04-26, and the Regional on 04-27. The Judges seminar will be put together by Noel Stockwell and Katie Cole. Betty Henslee is coordinating the banquet for Saturday night in Yakima. The auction and raffle will be coordinated by Paula Rutherford and Cheri Brietinger. Bonnie Varner is putting hospitality together. Trivets are 4 for \$72. Most agreed that we need 1 for BOB and maybe BOS but no more than that.

Next meeting will be October 13, 1996 at the Fall Trailing Event. The event will be at Ft. Steilacoom Park in Tacoma. Bring a sack lunch. The meeting should be around 2:00 PM or so with trailing in the morning. SEE RELATED ARTICLES. August 17, 1996 BOARD MEETING MINUTES

The Board Meeting was held immediately following the Membership Meeting on August 17, 1996. The 3 pending membership applications (Dave Lockridge, Katie Cole and Alan & Trenda Nichols) were approved for membership. The 1997 Regional Specialty Sweepstakes Judge ballot results were announced. 1st choice was Judy Robb (42 pts), 2nd was Lynne Aguirre (37 pts.), 3rd was Stacy Mattson (31 pts) and 4th was Jane Anderson (19 pts). A letter will be sent to Judy Robb advising her of the results and the agreement for judging. There was a long discussion on rejection of membership applications and the process for that was discussed as it has been revised in the By-Laws. A probationary period of membership was discussed and an additional \$5.00 application fee will be added to membership applications beginning January 1, 1997. The application fee will be non-refundable. A Membership Packet will contain a roster, current issue of the newsletter, By-Laws, Code of Ethics, and Membership Card. The meeting was ended at 12:48 AM August 18, 1996.
