The primary tourist season may be over, but October has produced a busy month for the Ocean Shores Convention Center with an eclectic mix of private and public events, some new and others returning annual favorites on the North Coast.

There's the first time for the "Bloodhound Beach Bash," which will occupy the entire Convention Center from Oct. 10-14.

This is an American Bloodhound Club (ABC) "National Specialty" dog show, plus a Regional Specialty show and several other event elements, including two days of bloodhound trailing activities in and around Ocean Shores

The last two days will be open to the public.

The event is produced by the Pacific Rim Bloodhound Club (PRBC), which has members in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, California, British Columbia, and Alberta, Canada.

Show chairperson Cindy Wolfrom of Carnation said she expects 80 or more dogs and about twice as many humans to participate in the event.

A dozen or so bloodhounds, plus their human handlers, are expected for the trailing events, on Monday and Tuesday, October 9 and 10. "People in Ocean Shores will definitely notice some bloodhounds around town those days," Wolfrom said.

The main room at the Convention Center will be set up for a traditional competitive dog show, as the site of four days of various competitions. Wednesday, October 10 will see a futurity event for breeders and an invitational "Top 20" event and catered banquet.

Thursday, October 11 will feature "veterans" events for dogs age seven and older, several puppy events, and a PRBC birthday party.

The "National Specialty" is a national level, once-ayear set of events specifically for bloodhounds taking place Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Event categories include Juniors, Veteran Classes, Dog & Bitch Classes, Best of Breed and Non-Regular Classes. A "Regional Specialty" with similar content is set for Saturday, from 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon.

These two days are open to the public, with admission by donation. A private, catered banquet will take place Friday evening.

Wolfrom said the selection of Ocean Shores was based on the Convention Center being large enough to host the event and having available dates, and her personal knowledge of the area as being very dog friendly.

And she knew there is some logistical and prep help available here, since her step-father is local artist and bloodhound lover Larry Walden.

Ocean Shores will be overrun with bloodhounds this coming week.

The Bloodhound Beach Bash will take place from Monday through Saturday at the Convention Center and beyond. This is an American Bloodhound Club National Specialty dog show, plus a Regional Specialty show and several other event elements.

Monday and Tuesday will involve outdoor exercises in what bloodhounds are famous for: trailing. The week will culminate in formal dog shows Friday and Saturday, which will be open to the public.

The event is produced by the Pacific Rim Bloodhound Club (PRBC), which has members in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, California, British Columbia and Alberta. Show chairwoman Cindy Wolfrom of Carnation said she expects 80 or more dogs and about twice as many humans to participate in the event.

A dozen or so bloodhounds, plus their human handlers, are expected for the trailing events. "People in Ocean Shores will definitely notice some bloodhounds around town those days," Wolfrom said.

Among the participants are Deb Thomas-Blake of South Aberdeen and her bloodhound, Hitchcock ("Hitch" to his friends). They also help with area search and rescue activities, and she operates the local nonprofit Harbor Rescue, which provides animal rescue, care and fostering for about 150 animals in the area each year.

Wednesday will see a futurity event for breeders and an invitational "Top 20" event and catered banquet. Thursday will feature "veterans" events for dogs ages seven and older, sev-

eral puppy events, and a PRBC birthday party.

The "National Specialty" — a national level, once-a-year set of events specifically for bloodhounds — will take place Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. Event categories include Juniors, Veteran Classes, Dog &Bitch Classes, Best of Breed and Non-Regular Classes.

A Regional Specialty show with similar content is set for Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to noon. These two days are open to the public, with admission by donation. A private, catered banquet will take place Friday evening.

Bloodhound Beach Bash Retrospective: The 2017 ABC National Specialty and Northwest Regional Reported by Lynn Harty

From October 9 through October 13, 2017, the American Bloodhound Club offered its forty-second National Specialty. Hosted by the Pacific Rim Bloodhound Club, the 2017 specialty was held at Ocean Shores, WA, the ABC's sixth Pacific Northwest venue for a National. A Regional Specialty on October 14 provided a fine conclusion to the week.

Getting to such a remote corner of the United States was not exactly a walk around the park for 53 Bloodhounds, with a total of 97 entered, along with their two-legged companions. Located on the Point Brown Peninsula on the southwest corner of Washington State, the town of Ocean Shores is known for its long Pacific beaches, dramatic sunsets, kitschy shops, and dog-loving community. What the region isn't known for is good weather in October, when driving wind and rain are common. This year, however, luck was with us, with mild and often sunny weather providing the perfect backdrop for six lively days packed with fun events. The Shilo Inn and the Ocean Shores Convention Center provided great amenities for this specialty venue.

Throughout the week, exhibitors were greeted in the ring by a remarkable group of judges: Christopher Cornell (Rally), Wendy Musgrove (Futurity Stake), Ellen Kroll (Puppy and Veteran Sweepstakes), Laura Pond (National Junior Showmanship), Camille McArdle (National Breed), Kristi Mann (Regional Breed and Junior Showmanship), and Karen Dewey, Bill Russell, and Pam Sage (Top Twenty Invitational).

The fun began with the National Specialty Trailing Trial on Monday and Tuesday, October 9 and 10. This event was dedicated to the memory of Ray Schmitt, whose years as an ABC mantrailing judge and, with his wife Kay, as a search-and rescue volunteer and a PRBC member, will long be remembered. As noted by TT Event Chair Janet Kelly, seven teams earned MT and MTI titles, as did four EECT teams, and all will be ready to tackle more trailing challenges in the near future. The trailing trial was followed by a welcome reception on October 10, giving everyone the chance to meet, greet, and reconnect with new and old friends from around the country.

Wednesday, October 11, brought a full day of activities, including Rally and Futurity judging, a seminar by ABC National Trailing Trial Committee Chair Jan Rothwell, and the ABC's thirteenth Top Twenty Invitational competition. In the Rally Advanced B and Rally Excellent B classes, onlookers had the pleasure of watching Teresa Mullens and Bloodhound Lula Maple Leap The Moon RA AX AXJ ("Lula") dominate some very complex precision healing patterns. Judge Christopher Cornell went out of his way to explain the principles of rally to a good-sized group of spectators. Lula qualified in both classes and won the high combined award to much acclaim and cheering from the audience!

Jan Rothwell's "Gaining Your Bloodhound's Attention" seminar drew a group of enthusiastic participants, many with Bloodhounds in tow and with lots of questions to ask. Jan advocates working with Bloodhounds of all ages in short and successful training sessions. The short version of her training philosophy is this: "Dogs get it. We are the problem!" Well said, Jan, and thanks for a very informative and enjoyable seminar. Many of us will be phoning you for more advice.

"Be Inspired," the 2017 Top Twenty Invitational, showcased the beauty and correctness of eight of the nation's top Bloodhounds, with judges Karen Dewey, Pam Sage, and Bill Russell providing their considerable combined judging expertise. This year's Top Twenty Invitational was dedicated to the memory of Fritz Schmidt, Great Grimpen Mire kennels, an honorary member of the ABC with more than 40 years of membership in the club, including serving as its president from 1986 to 1988.

Thursday, October 12, began with a judges' education seminar presented by Susan Hamil. Included in the two


-hour seminar was a mantrailing demonstration by Becky Irving and GCH Jo-Li's Searching for Oz ("Clara") to illustrate how form follows function in our breed. Next came Puppy and Veteran Sweepstakes, followed by an Itty Bitty Puppy Match, and Bloodhounds from the exuberance of youth to the dignity of old age brought a tear to many an eye.

Friday, October 13, was a very lucky day for all of us who showed in and watched the National Specialty judging of Junior Showmanship, the Regular and Non-Regular classes, and Best of Breed competition. The 2017 ABC National Specialty was dedicated, in celebration and loving memory, to the life and contributions of Anne LeHew Legge, who, at the age of 84, left us much, much too soon. Anne's ongoing commitment to Bloodhounds and the American Bloodhound Club defies description. She was, quite simply, a force of nature, and there will never be another like her.

Saturday, October 14, our final day of judging, was reserved for the ABC's 2017 Northwest Regional Specialty. What a treat it was to see such a fine contingent of Bloodhounds in the ring for a second day. Pacific Northwesterners especially loved seeing our own Kristi Mann doing the judging honors. A Seattle native and a protégé of Jackie Sinkinson, Kristi began her life with Bloodhounds when she was only twelve. That happy occurrence launched her on a professional and personal path of loving and showing Bloodhounds, Shi Tzu and many other breeds, always with grace, style, and a sense of humor.

No National Specialty retrospective would be complete without mentioning the week's added attractions: the wonderful apparel and merchandise for sale, the ever-popular raffles and live auction, the scrumptious banquets, Chuck-a-Duck, Bingo Night, and a 21st birthday party for the Pacific Rim Bloodhound Club. PRBC members, we have finally come of age!
