PRBC Members had a great time at the 1997 American Bloodhound Club National Specialty June 12-16. The National was held on the grounds of Purina Farms located about 60 miles southwest of St. Louis, MO.

AKC TRACKING: There were 3 TD entries and 2 TDX entries. Of those only Nimrods Joy of Lost Nation qualified and earned her TD.

OBEDIENCE: The Obedience events offered many Bloodhound enthusiasts to see a Bloodhound follow through in obedience. Julie Hill with CH. Masterpiece Maybe I'm Amazed CDX TD (Lark) garnered High In Trial honors with a score of 195/200. Lark was bred by Suzi Paine. CH. Legacy T-Bone Bittersweet also qualified for her first CD leg with a score of 185!

The event was held at Robertsville State Park just a short distance from the motel. Finishing the Trailing series with new MTX titles are CH. The Rectory's Monk owned by Don and Brenda Mitchell and handled by Don Mitchell and

CH. Legacy T-Bone Bittersweet owned and handled by Dr. A. Brooke Holt DVM. The MTI title was earned by CH. Cassandra of Legacy owned by Adriana Pavlinovic and Anne Legge and handled by Adriana. Picking up thier first leg, the Mantrailer title were CH. Twin Hyls Gabriella Is Wild owned and handled by Linda Gottlieb; CH. Legacys Bobaloo owned by Pavlinovic and Legge and handled by Adriana Pavlinovic; Shericks Chiso's Tracker owned and handled by Linda West; and CH. Hylbillies Hygh Wild Gypsy TD owned and handled by Linda Gottlieb.

An excellent Canine First Aid Class was given by Dr. Karen Leshkivich covering most emergency situations including some things that may occur in the field, eye problems, bloat and response to emergencies. A brief handout was included and covers basic information as well as items for a basic Bloodhound first aid kit.

Throughout the National folks had a chance to meet and greet old friends and new ones, sit by the pool, squeeze in to a shady spot now and then and try to keep cool. Dogs were well behaved and it was not uncommon to see dogs of all sizes and ages romping together in the large grassy bowl next to the motel. The event was not without glitches however. One day the water main to the motel broke leaving us high and dry and HOT for a few hours, lightening and thunder washed through the area several times with thunder rolls that would shake the ground. Bloodhound response to the thunder was to yell back! The photo contest drew many entries and there were some terrific pictures. The Bloodhound Boutique sold several different T-shirts (we should have had ours there!), caps, muchies for the dogs, collectibles and odds and ends. One thing we should add to the collection are some visors for those that don't wear caps but need the sun protection!

Hospitality seemed well supplied with a number of goodies and went through numerous cases of water. By the 3rd day there was no more bottled water in the area in the small bottles and folkd had to start refilling their own bottles.

The Meritorious Service Award was presented to Susan Rowe. Breed Judge Arlene Thompson Brown spoke kindly of the Bloodhounds at the banquet and said she had been looking forward to the National for two years. She did say she though about wearing a wetsuit to judge in but didn't want to offend anyone! She felt the dogs were better than the bitches and urged breeders to watch the eyes and shoulders of our dogs.

The ABC Annual Meeting was held at the Dog Museum in Jaynesville, MO and members and guests were treated to a private viewing of the museum and contents. The museum is an older estate complete with acres of grounds for horses, dogs and a park. The museum was spotlighting the Bloodhound in honor of our National and there were

many wonderful pieces of Bloodhound art and collectibles on loan and owned by the museum.

There were 209 entries for this National which is the largest entry to date in the history of the American Bloodhound Club. The Veteran classes and the puppy classes were terrific to see and the who entry was breathtaking to have so many Bloodhounds together in one place. The grounds were wonderful (except for the storms) and there were 2-3 other activities going on at Purina Farms at the same time without hindering one another.

Despite the very humid weather, thunderstorms and a few area tornado's the five days went quickly and folks had a good time. Those PRBC members in attendance made notes for the 1999 we will be hosting.
