Meeting Minutes: Puyallup, WA January 13, 2008:

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 by Susan Paine. Minutes recorded by Sonnya Crawford.

Minutes of the Last Meeting: Susan Paine read minutes of the most recent general meeting, held August 4, 2007 at Argus Ranch Facility, Auburn WA. Katie moved to accept the minutes and Janis seconded. The minutes were accepted.

Katie asked for discussion on a topic from the previous minutes and Susan approved the discussion. Katie asked about the new banner and why we are keeping the same colors. Tina said that her Aunt Sharon or Aunt Lavonne at Siglers would be willing to give us a bid and probably give us a good price on a new banner. There was a lot of lively discussion about design, color and size. I am very excited about the upcoming year for PRBC and look forward to seeing everyone at various events!



Report of the Committees:

Rescue Committee - Sonnya Crawford, Janis Hardy, Laurie Adomite, Susan Paine

Sonnya Crawford read the Rescue report:

Fat Suzi is still with us, although she has been put on a diet and has lost weight. (106lb to 93lbs)

We took Buster out of Bloodhound Rescue and adopted him through GHVS as he was more of a "mixed-breed" bloodhound. The donation that his owner made when he was released to GHVS went to PRBC Rescue. Buster found a home last week with Charlotte Yarkoni from Gig Harbor.

Annie was fostered and subsequently adopted by Larry and Janet Law and joins their other Rescued bloodhound Elliott.

Redd, adopted by the Zimburean family, had some aggression episodes and was returned to Rescue where he was humanely euthanized.





We received an extremely aggressive BH, Jack, into Rescue in November, 2007. He was immediately euthanized as he was too aggressive to safely feed or care for.

We were called by PAWS in Lynnwood to pickup a liver and tan female bloodhound, "Daisy". Nancy Seanor picked her up last week and is fostering her for us.

We have been in contact with Chris Toepell, Jake Handley and Gail Yandell who all have bloodhounds that they are considering putting into Rescue. As of yet, none of these have materialized, but they are certainly possibilities. The Yandell dog has been bounced around in Oregon for at least a year that we are aware of. The Handley dog has been in and out of at least one other home and has aggressive tenden-

We use old carpeting in the dog houses for the hounds to sleep on and have to cut up new pieces every few weeks. Tim recently went to the landfill and begged them for throw-away carpeting. We did get some, but they don't typically let people take it. If anyone has a contact for used carpeting, please let us know and we will pick it up.

Harnesses: GHVS is selling Easy Walk harnesses with \$5 of each sale going to Rescue. We have currently sold 20 harnesses (\$100). Toys: We have been selling toys at GHVS that Central Pet donated with all funds going to Rescue. We are almost out and would love to get more. Tina was asked if she could contact Central Pet about donating more toys.

Janis Hardy's report: She is trying to reach Adam Yandell who she has talked to multiple times in the past. She also said that the Rest Area fundraiser garnered \$170 and Janis would like it to be used to help pay off the debt to the Crawfords. Kim seconded.

Kim Bialakowski has a 9-yr-old Rescue in Canada that needs a home and would like us to help. She is getting desperate to place her. This is a Black and Tan female.

A lively Discussion about the backyard breeder, Rebecca Hungerford ensued, as she has a new litter and we get a large number of her dogs into Rescue.

Janis advised that Rescue needs new business cards.--- Sonnya will work on this.

2008 Trailing Trial Committee – Lynn Harty was absent but submitted her report in writing which was read by Susan Paine: I regret not being with you for the January 2008 PRBC meeting but send my best wishes and warm regards to you. Here is an update on our 2008 Memorial weekend trailing trial

Clyde Reed was a life member of the American Bloodhound Club, an honorary deputy sheriff in Pierce County, Washington, and a founding member of the Northwest Bloodhound Search and Rescue organization. His dedication to bloodhounds, participation in mantrailing, and support of beginning and veteran dog-and-handler teams will long be remembered.

In honor of Clyde's life and his contributions to mantrailing, and in conjunction with Pacific Rim Bloodhound Club and Inland Empire Bloodhound Search and Rescue, Sid and Lynn Harty offer the Third Annual Clyde Reed Memorial Trailing Trial, a two-day trailing event on Friday, May 23, and Saturday, May 24, 2008 (ABC trailing trial committee approval received, ABC board approval pending). The trailing trial will be based at the Hartys' home: 13711 S. Sands Road, Valleyford, WA 99036 (8 miles SE of Spokane, WA). MT, MTI, and MTX trails will be offered; EECTs will be accommodated by request and judges' availability. Judges Suzi Paine, Keith Pikett, Sid Harty, and Kim Bialkowski will be on hand to test the mettle of dogs and handlers alike.

Premium lists will be available online at the Pacific Rim Bloodhound Club web site (www.pacificrimbloodhoundclub.org) in late March 2008, and an advertisement for the trailing trial will be published in the next ABC newsletter.

2008 Regional Specialty Committee - Suzi Paine, Janis Hardy, Sonnya Crawford— Regionals will be held Aug 2 in conjunction with the hound classic. We are very excited that two bloodhound people will be judging our show. The hound show will be hosting a bloodhound sweepstakes this year. Sonnya needs to talk to Tim Whetstine to see if he will commit to cooking dinner again. We will be taking 4 camping sites this year w/ Crawfords to rent 3 spots and PRBC renting 1 spot. Lunches will be box lunches (probably from Jennifer Loso—to be confirmed).

New Appointed Position/Membership Chair - In accordance with bylaws, we have created a Membership Chair position to handle all the membership duties formerly done by our secretary and treasurer. Marie Taylor has accepted this position and the duties are being transitioned currently.

New Business: Tina will be showing her own dog, Hollywood. Congratulations to Janis and Follie on Follie's first major today at the Puyallup show.


Adjournment: Sonnya motioned to adjourn. The meeting was ad-

Rescue Update

February 25, 2008

We currently have 6 bloodhounds in Rescue. Daisy is a 2 year old female bloodhound. She travels well in a car and has a VERY sweet temperament. She is a bit timid though. She is good with cats and children, but doesn't get along with some dogs. She does have a tendency to dig if she is left outside and gets bored... She is housebroken and would make a wonderful family member!





Dallas is a VERY sweet, well mannered approximately 2 year old boy! He travels in a car well. He does well with other dogs and cats. We are not sure how he does with children, though he has been very sweet with everyone he has met. He was a stray, which makes his wonderful demeanor all the more amazing!! He is a gentle boy that is

looking for a family to open their hearts to him!!

Dixie is a young, spayed female bloodhound. She is a little over a year old. She is crate trained and will sit on command. She is good with adults, and older/assertive children. She does well with other dogs, but does play a bit rough for some. She is good with cats, but WILL chase

them if they run. Jeb is a 2 year old neutered male

bloodhound. He was surrendered to rescue when his owners were no

longer able to keep him. He does well with other dogs, cats and children. He is housetrained, microchipped and current on vaccinations. He kennels well and travels well in cars.



Jess is a 5 year old female bloodhound. She is house trained, kennels well, and travels well. Jess likes other dogs, does well with cats, and does well with children. She was surrendered to rescue when her family was no longer able to keep her and her brother Jeb. She is looking for a forever home where she can share all that love she has to give. This is Jess' second time here at PRBC Rescue!

Suzi is approx 5 to 6 years old. She has had a very unstable life, as she

has been in and out of several homes. Despite that, she has a wonderful personality, and loves people. She is a little overweight, but has been on a diet and it has been very successful! She has lost 18 pounds! She does well with older children, but we are not sure how she does with younger children. She



would do best being the only dog in a family, as she has a history of not getting along with some dogs. She is not overly aggressive however towards them and can be walked easily in public places. She has a huge, loving heart and she is patiently waiting for her "forever family" to come along and open their hearts to her!!

PRBC Rescue is currently seeking volunteers to come out and deep-clean the runs with the power-washer. We would also appreciate any leads on used carpeting, as we use the carpeting for bedding in the dog houses and have to replace it often. If you know of anyone replacing their carpeting, please let us know and we will find a way to come and get it.

AKC Naming of Dogs

As posted on the AKC Web site there has been change to the naming rules for registered dogs:

Effective February 1, 2008, a pilot program will be put in place to enable an owner to register a dog with a name of 37 to 50 spaces, rather than being held to the usual 36 space limit. The fee for names exceeding 36 spaces will be \$10.00.
