Location:

The administrative base for the trailing trial will be the home of Sid and Lynn Harty, 13711 S. Sands Road, Valleyford, WA 99036. Maps and driving directions may be requested or accessed at www.maps.google.com. Trails will be laid in Valleyford, Freeman, Mica, Rockford, and the City of the Spokane Valley, Washington.

Trailing Levels / Number of Trails Offered:

EECTs as requested and if available / 6 trails (2 MT, 2 MTI, and 2 MTX) will be offered.

ALL entries must be accompanied by the correct fees (US funds only), the completed entry form, and documentation of prior trailing titles earned for each dog entered as indicated below:

Mantrailer: One copy of the EECT certificate

Mantrailer Intermediate: One copy of the MT certificate

Mantrailer Excellent: One copy of the MTI certificate

Lottery Selection Procedure:

If more entries per event are received for any trailing level than there are trails available, participants will be selected by lottery (see Sections 9.1 and 9.2 of the ABC Trailing Trial Standard). Alternates for trails will be drawn in compliance with the Trailing Trial Standard; after completing the lottery selection procedure, the event secretary will email all entrants of their standing. All entries over and above confirmed and alternate status will be returned to those persons submitting the entries.

Entry Fees (US funds only):

Mantrailer \$75 / Mantrailer Intermediate \$100 / Mantrailer Excellent \$130. EECTs (\$25) may be requested and will be accommodated if possible.

Entries for the trailing trial will open on Monday, March 28, 2022, and will close on Wednesday, April 27, 2022, at 5 PM, and must be received by that date and time. Entries must be sent via US mail; faxed and/or emailed entries will NOT be accepted.

Trophies: Each successful MT, MTI, or MTX hound and handler team will receive an ABC rosette. Trailing certificates will be mailed after the trailing trial paperwork has been recorded.

This trailing event has been approved by the American Bloodhound Club and will be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the American Bloodhound Club Trailing Trial Standard, which may be downloaded from the American Bloodhound Club website.

The ABC Trailing Trial Standard approved January 2020, specifically SECTIONS 8 and 9, will be followed regarding the filing of entries for each level offered.

The bloodhound entered must meet the eligibility criteria as specified in the American Bloodhound Club Field Trial Standard as revised and approved January 2020.
